Over 2019/20, this program funded nine projects totaling \$111,105.

Project Area	Project Description	Amount
Colvalli	Replacement fence that helps disburse cattle on the pasture.	\$13,324
Cranbrook-Ft Steele	Fence was built to ensure cattle are not on the recently completed Rails to Trails project from Rampart to Wardner.	\$5,186
Dutch-Findlay	Replacing old non-functional fence to ensure cattle stay within the prescribed pasture.	\$19,800
Grasmere	Holding pen and corral that will enable the rancher to better manage cattle on the range by having a spot to keep them prior to release and when gathering to move to another pasture.	\$1,200
Hawkins Creek	New range fence configuration that will allow cattle to better access water while in the different pastures.	\$4,000
Peckhams Lake	Removal of invasive species through herbicide application, harrowing and dragging to create a viable seed and better seeding of more appropriate domestic grasses will enhance the range and provide more palatable feed for both cattle and wildlife.	\$28,380
Rampart-Mayook	Replacement of fences that will ensure cattle are kept within the confines of specific pastures and out of the Kootenay River.	\$7,991
Rocky-Chipka	Replacement and new fence were installed after a new rancher was approved to utilize the pastures in this area. First of a number of improvements are required to the aged range infrastructure in this Range Unit.	\$23,224
Various	Research work on the efficacy of fertilizers in dry forest areas.	\$8,000
