

## GRASSLAND AND RANGELAND ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM

### 2023/24

The Grassland and Rangeland Enhancement Program supported nine projects across the region in 2023/24, providing a total of \$278,330 in funding to improve forage availability, support sustainable grazing practices and enhance habitat for wildlife.

Project Area	Project Description	Amount
Colvalli	Installation of a well to provide additional water sources to support continued grazing on four pastures.	\$33,170
Cranbrook	Replacement of fencing top wire with wooden top rails and increasing height of bottom wire to improve wildlife crossing areas for ungulates.	\$5,300
Dutch Findlay	Fence replacement to contain cattle within appropriate pasture and exclude livestock from an active forestry cut block.	\$23,908
Elk River	Installation of a well to support continued use of forage by cattle and remove need to transport water.	\$31,998
Grasmere	Installation of a well to support continued use of forage by cattle and provide an additional water source for wildlife.	\$43,923
Peckhams	Seeding refurbishment and fence installation to improve forage production and provide a source of young plants for wildlife.	\$60,105
Pickering Hills	Manual removal of invasive plant species to support organic certification requirements.	\$4,270
Region-wide	Installation of active cattle grazing signage.	\$618
Region-wide	Rancher Sprayer Program to address invasive plants, including an invasive plant education component.	\$75,038
