

## GRASSLAND AND RANGELAND ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM 2025/26

The Grassland and Rangeland Enhancement Program supported nine projects in 2025/26, providing a total of \$295,015 in funding to improve pasture management, enhance water availability, reduce wildlife conflicts and support sustainable cattle grazing practices across the region.

Project Area	Project Description	Amount
Hawkins Range Unit	Installation of new boundary fence to improve utilization of forage in upper reaches of the pasture.	\$14,617
Lower Peavine Range Unit	Replacement and repair of fencing to ensure cattle remain in the appropriate pasture and improve ungulate movement on wildlife crossings.	\$26,484
Peavine Range Unit	Fenceline repairs, including replacement of fence posts.	\$43,923
Peckham's Range Unit	Improvements to watering lanes at Cultus and Alkaline lakes to protect riparian areas.	\$6,159
Rampart-Mayook Range Unit	Installation of wildfire-friendly fencing and a water trough to replace a dugout and support riparian rehabilitation.	\$10,577
Region-wide	Rancher Sprayer Program to address invasive plants, including an invasive plant education component.	\$118,716
Upper Peavine/Joseph Creek and Baker Range Units	Virtual fencing pilot project using GPS cattle collars to protect wetlands and reduce the need for internal cross-fencing.	\$36,252
Waldo Range Unit	Installation of a new solar powered well to support continued use of pastures by cattle and remove need to transport water.	\$32,470
Wildhorse Lewis Range Unit	Fence installation by landowners and guest ranch operators to contain cattle.	\$5,817
