| Canal Flats | Village of Canal Flats | Community Park | Develop public washrooms and a pavilion. The pavilion will be open to the public for family events and will feature prominently in Canal Flats festivals. Both buildings are part of the 2018 Park Plan adopted by Council. | \$174,900 |
| Harrop | Harrop & District Community Centre Society | Schoolhouse Grounds | Improve the grounds around the schoolhouse by establishing a walkway, a meditative garden area and gathering/seating spaces that will cultivate an atmosphere for interactive social gatherings. | \$26,536 |
| Invermere | District of Invermere | Downtown Revitalization | Increase directional signage to promote local businesses; add street trees with lighting, benches, tables and bike racks; and install integrated sound systems to ensure that downtown is a vibrant all-season business centre for residents and visitors. The project is a multi-year, project to revitalize and enhance Invermere's downtown along 7 th Ave. | \$377,775 |
| Jaffray | Regional District of East Kootenay | Jaffray Community Hall Greenspace | Construct a timber-frame pavilion that will serve as an outdoor meeting space, celebration space and classroom. Include shade trees, a cement brick firepit, a public washroom and a concession. The space will become a welcoming place for residents and visitors of Jaffray and outlying areas. | \$296,100 |
| Kimberley | City of Kimberley | Platzl Revitalization | Add benches around the existing gazebo, picnic tables with seating for those with disabilities, chairs and a tri-level water fountain; update the parking lot walkway; and increase bicycle parking and charging stations. Using ideas submitted by residents and businesses, this project will ensure the Platzl will remain vibrant, welcoming and accessible to all ages and abilities. | \$88,809 |

| Montrose | Village of Montrose | Park/C-CERC Building Revitalization (Comprehensive Community and Education Resource Centre) | Build a covered stage, create a gathering area and install lights to facilitate public gathering through art and musical performances and programs. | \$136,241 |
| Nelson | City of Nelson | Railtown Plaza | Create an outdoor public plaza and event space available and accessible to the whole community, instilling new life to the area while celebrating and contributing to its historical context and character. | \$219,156 |
| Radium Hot Springs | Village of Radium Hot Springs | Reunion Grove Community Firepits | Develop three communal firepits with circular bench seating near the existing community hall, rink and parking areas. This project is a component of the Village's Park Master Plan and is expected to increase cold-weather use of the park. | \$33,000 |
| Rivervale | Regional District of Kootenay Boundary | Rivervale Community Park | Expand the park to increase capacity for activities like family gatherings, community events and picnics. | \$14,022 |
| Salmo | Village of Salmo | Lions Park upgrades | Build a new year-round washroom to help increase park use, add a summer drinking fountain and landscape the park to create a welcoming entrance that is coordinated with the planned Art Wall work. | \$36,447 |
| Slocan | Village of Slocan | Waterfront Development | Start implementing the Village's 2018 Waterfront Development Strategy, including landscaping the northwest portion of the waterfront, adding irrigation, continuing a block wall and adding a railway and gangway ramp to make the existing breakwater pedestrian friendly. | \$282,034 |
| Trail | City of Trail | Groutage Avenue Esplanade Development | Extend the south end of the Esplanade in Jubilee Park to the West Trail plaza of the Columbia River Skywalk, creating an attraction for tourists and residents for informal and formal gatherings. | \$250,350 |
